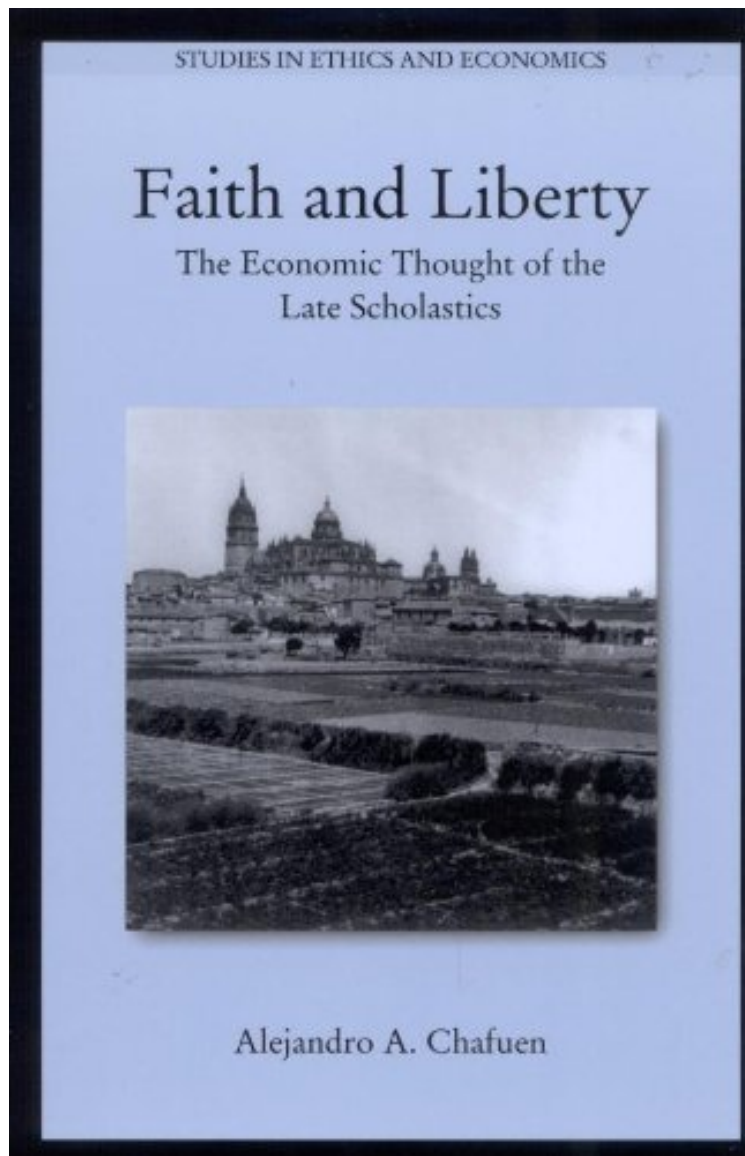

The Late-Scholastics, as they are called, were the first to engage in a systematic moral analysis of the ethical issues associated with trade and commerce.
