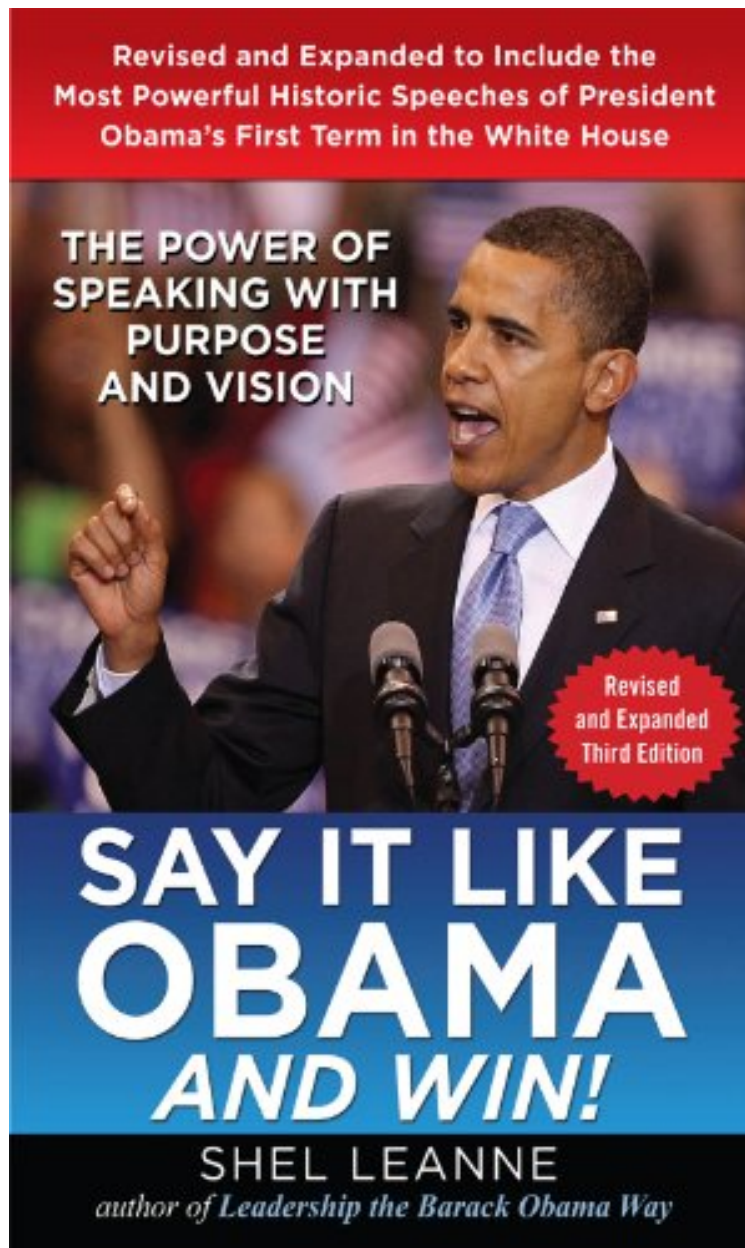

The author's writing style is detailed, informative, encouraging and educational. I liked the "What We've Learned" summaries at the end of each chapter to reinforce key concepts.At times, the author's writing style takes on a laudatory tone and drifts to non-speech-related facets about Mr. Obama. For example, "If you aspire to be a highly effective leader, people must trust your judgment and ethics and have confidence in your leadership abilities, believing you are worthy of authority... Barack Obama has done this with great success, gaining the trust and confidence of a broad array of people..." (Page 20) The author also wrote a highly acclaimed leadership book about Mr. Obama. Such a quote, along with a few others specifically about leadership qualities, would have been a better fit in the other book.Actual SpeechesThe most salient feature of this book was the acute attention given to Mr. Obama's famous speeches. The volume of the author's research was a masterclass in detailed presentation, painstaking analysis, along with precise attribution. She put significant effort to dig very deep into President Obama's past and present speeches which provide an excellent learning tool for any student of communication.Negative FeatureThere was no index to help the reader reference key points which was a disappointing editorial decision. The contents section was extremely detailed; however, it wasn't in alphabetical order as an index would be. Most readers scan the contents section and bank on a good index to find specific items of interest.Notable Quotes"Another important lesson of Obama's outstanding communication style is how he leverages shared experiences to build rapport and a strong sense of camaraderie.
